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**SCIENTIFIC EXPERTS TO EXAMINE FUTURE OF DIETARY SUPPLEMENT  
RESEARCH AT THE WORKSHOP  
—Registration for the CRN Scientific Symposium Now Open—**

WASHINGTON, D.C., *July 1, 2010* — The Council for Responsible Nutrition (CRN) will host an impressive line-up of top scientific experts to offer thought-provoking insight and discourse on critical aspects of future dietary supplement research, at the popular one day symposium CRN's *The Workshop: A Day of Science*, taking place September 29, 2010 at the Hyatt Regency Lost Pines Resort & Spa, Austin, Texas.

Eileen Kennedy, D.Sc., dean, Tufts Friedman School of Nutrition, Science and Policy, will open the symposium with a Keynote address entitled, "*Overfed and undernourished: A global perspective on the role of dietary supplements in dietary guidance.*" Following Dr. Kennedy's presentation, the day will be divided into four consecutive scientific sessions, each focusing on a different aspect of dietary supplement research.

The first session features speakers John Milner, Ph.D., National Institutes of Health, National Cancer Institute; Renger Witkamp, Ph.D., Wageningen University, The Netherlands; and Ronald Krauss, M.D., Children's Hospital Oakland Research Institute, and member of the Institute Of Medicine (IOM) expert committee on the topic of biomarkers.

In the second session Robin Marles, Ph.D., Health Canada, will examine how science drives policy, based on case histories from the regulatory body. Following lunch, a panel will offer insights on recent advances in nutrigenomics/nutrigenetics with guest speakers Robert Superko, M.D, Celera; Steven Zeisel, Ph.D., University of North Carolina; and Ray Rodriguez, Ph.D., University of California, Davis.

*The Workshop* concludes with a look to the future, with a presentation by George Burdock, Ph.D., Burdock Group on the application of nanotechnology research to dietary supplements.
