SAFETY ALERT: SARMs CAN HARM What you need to know

- 1. Selective Androgen Receptor Modulators (SARMs) are dangerous and illegal, and have been found in a number of adulterated products masquerading as "dietary supplements." SARMs are unapproved drugs, not dietary supplements.
- 2. SARMs pose a risk to all consumers, including athletes, and should be avoided, as they can result in potentially life-threatening consequences.
- 3. SARMs may be listed on the product label (with names like "ostarine" and "andarine"). Or they may not be listed in the ingredients at all. That's why it's important to purchase dietary supplements from companies you know and trust—those that don't make drug-like claims.
- 4. Sports nutrition dietary supplements can play a beneficial role in your workout routine. But keep this in mind: dietary supplements are not intended to have the same immediate or dramatic effects that you would expect from taking a drug. Labels that sound too good to be true, probably are.
